## School Uniform

Uniforms don't help pass exams. However, Kelso High School is so much more than just passing exams. We strive to ensure all our pupils do the best they possibly can as they prepare to go out into the world of work. A uniform supersedes fashion, it's smart and it helps put everyone in the right frame of mind and gives our young people a sense of pride within the community and beyond.

We are, therefore, asking all students from S1-5 to wear a black v-necked jumper or cardigan, black tie, white shirt, black trousers (no denim) or a black skirt and black shoes. Our S6 students will wear a black tie and their chosen coloured jumper so that they are easily recognised.

No hooded tops will be worn as part of the uniform although it will be possible to wear these as part of their PE kit.

## Attendance and Lateness

***The attendance rate at Kelso has always been very high and is better than the national average. Unauthorised absences, which include family holidays, are lower than the national average. Attendance is checked every period. It is also very important that our young people arrive to school on time and this is also closely monitored.***

The school operates a system called Groupcall whereby a message is sent to a parent to alert them if their child has not arrived at school in the morning and we are not aware of the reason for this. It is, therefore, important that you telephone the school, before 9.15am, to inform us if a child is going to be absent.

We expect pupils who have been absent from school to make every effort to catch up on the missed work on their return. If this might prove to be difficult, parents should contact the Pastoral Teacher, who may be able to arrange for some additional support.

While we do not encourage parents to take children on family holidays during term time, we recognise that there are occasions when this is unavoidable. Regrettably, we are unable to authorise such absences other than in truly exceptional circumstances. Parents should advise the school of planned absences in writing.

## Communication

Good communication between home and school is an essential component of a good educational experience. A Bulletin of information is published daily and is discussed with pupils during registration time. A weekly update is emailed to all parents and is available on the website every Friday during term time. In addition, letters are sent out via email to appropriate parental groups concerning exam arrangements, parents' evenings and other events in the school. The school also publishes a School Improvement Report each September. This reviews the work of the school over the past year.

Groupcall is also used to inform parents of emergency school closures, confirm dates of parents' evenings and any relevant school information which needs to be relayed to parents quickly. All parents are encouraged to supply the school with an up to date e-mail address as we use e-mail to communicate letters home, send tracking reports etc.

There is a School website ([www.kelsohighschool.org.uk](http://www.kelsohighschool.org.uk)) which contains information about the school, events and much more. It is updated regularly.

Parents are always welcome to contact the school with queries or items for discussion. Normally, the first point of contact should be the child's Pastoral Teacher.

## School Canteen

Our school canteen is available to all our young people during morning break and lunchtime on a Monday - Thursday. On a Friday our morning break is extended to 20 minutes to allow our young people to have more time to eat something as we do not finish on a Friday until 1.20pm.

All our young people are expected to stay within the school grounds during morning break and the new S1s will also be asked to stay with the school grounds over lunchtime. This will be in place until the beginning of the SQA exams which normally begin in May. If a young person would like to return home or to a family member during lunchtime then a letter/email of confirmation would be required at the start of the session.

Pupils are able to pre-order and pay for items from the canteen using the Fusion app on their mobile device. This will help to reduce queues at lunchtime. The app works alongside the existing cashless catering system used by school catering teams and is linked to ParentPay. The funds are added on to the pupil's account in exactly the same way as before – i.e. using ParentPay (online) or the reval units (cash) in schools.

## Hand Held Devices

As part of SBCs Inspire Learning, all our young people have already been provided with an iPad. This programme is aimed at raising attainment and supporting equity and inclusion for all our young people. Digital technology will not replace teachers or books however it will provide the opportunity for our young people to develop a level of general and specialist digital skills that are vital for learning, life and work in an increasingly digital world. Mobile phones within school are increasingly becoming a distraction to teaching and learning. With the introduction of the iPads we have decided as a school to ask our young people to have all mobile phones switched off and in their bags throughout the school day.

For all urgent messages that are required to be passed on during the school day we ask that these are made through our school office. Every classroom has a telephone and so we are able to contact every young person every lesson.

## Developing the Young Workforce (DYW)

We are committed to ensuring we provide our learners with opportunities to explore the following within their S1 curriculum at Kelso High School:

### **Career Education**

Delivered in PSE (1 period per week) and across the school, helping our young people develop the knowledge, confidence and skills they need to make well informed, relevant choices and plans for their future, so they can progress smoothly into further learning and work.

### **Career Management Skills**

- Develop personal awareness around likes, dislikes, strengths and weaknesses including registering with the My World of Work school resource ([www.myworldofwork.co.uk](http://www.myworldofwork.co.uk))
- Learn about the careers available to them in the future, as well as trends for the Scottish Borders & National job market
- Take action to build a career pathway & receive support from our Careers Advisor

## Family Learning at Kelso High School

Family learning is more than simply engaging parents with school. It is about building their understanding of education, of what their children are learning and why, and indeed allowing them to learn themselves and with their children. It has been shown to be a key part of helping us close the attainment gap and ensure all young people can do their very best in school.

Research has shown that when parents take an interest in their child's learning, they are much more likely to perform well and meet their potential.

For some parents, this comes naturally to them; for others this is trickier – and we seek to remove the barriers, some of which are highlighted below.

- **Poor experience of their own schooling**
- **Too much use of jargon by professionals meaning parents find it difficult to provide support or get fully involved in learning as they don't understand what their children are being taught**
- **Lack of self-belief that what they do makes a difference**
- **Parents' own literacy and numeracy may not be as good or robust as they would like**
- **Health conditions, be these physical, mental or emotional**

Our overall vision at KHS in terms of Family Learning reflects the expectation of effective and impactful practise as suggested by The Scottish Government in their document *How Good Is Our School 4*.

***“Parents are fully engaged in the life of the school and as a result are much more meaningfully engaged in their childrens’ learning. Anything that might stop them doing this are addressed by school.”***
